The Foundation is thrilled to be able to share with you the many ways it influenced the lives of students and staff alike during the 07/08 school year. The photo above was taken at the Foundation's first annual Legacy awards dinner. The faces alone are enough to communicate the joy of that evening where students, teachers, staff and volunteers were honored. The evening was a celebration of all that is right within our district and the Foundation was honored to be able to recognize those pictured.

During the past year the Foundation:

- Awarded \$30,500 in grants to teachers,
- Provided a \$3,500 scholarship to an Eden Prairie senior and \$12,000 in total scholarships to four Eden Prairie High School students,
- Provided a \$3,500 grant to the Teacher-of-the-Year honored at the Legacy Awards dinner, and
- Provided \$2,100 to various Eden Prairie Schools through the Foundation's "Present With a Future" program.

That's \$48,100 in total support which is more than double last year's figure. The Foundation had an impact on students' lives. This would not have been possible without the support of individual and corporate donors and the efforts of many volunteers who helped make the year's events so successful. The Foundation is grateful to all who provided their time, talents and financial gifts during the year.

The Foundation is embarking on an ambitious program to raise a \$3,000,000 endowment fund over the next five years. This program, which is further described in this report, will allow the Foundation to change lives for years to come. This is the "Legacy of Giving" that defines the Foundation's purpose. FOUNDATION FOR EDEN PRAIRIE SCHOOLS LAUNCHING \$3,000,000 CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

The Foundation for Eden Prairie Schools will raise a \$3,000,000 Endowment Fund over the next five years. This fundraising effort will be in addition to its Annual Fund campaign. The Foundation seeks to have a significant and lasting impact on the quality of public education in Eden Prairie and the Endowment Fund will provide steady and predictable financial resources that can be directed toward pressing needs and innovative ideas within the district. Other Twin Cities school districts have already raised, or are raising similar endowment funds. The Endowment Fund will allow individuals and businesses that value and appreciate the impact our schools have on their lives and community an opportunity to take part in sustaining our school district's reputation. An initial \$100,000 commitment has already been received from an anonymous individual donor.

The Taste of Eatin' Prairie was held on February 23, 2008, at the Minnesota Vikings Fieldhouse. Over 20 restaurants provided food and drink to over 500 guests. Ticket sales, financial donations and a silent auction all contributed to the most successful Taste of Eatin' Prairie to date. The Foundation netted over \$30,000 from the event. This is our largest fundraiser of the year and would not be possible without the generous participation of local restaurants, donated silent auction items, and the hundreds of volunteer hours leading up to the event. The Foundation would also like to thank and acknowledge the Minnesota Vikings who donated their fieldhouse for the occasion. Next year's event promises to be bigger and better. FOUNDATION GRANTS HAVE AN EFFECT ON STUDENTS / STAFF

As a result of the funding provided by FEPS, the "Go Green" project directly and powerfully impacted 58 fourth grade students. These students had the time of their lives designing, building, and testing model wind turbines that produced electricity. Students also used higher level thinking skills to engineer and race model cars powered by hydrogen fuel cells. Throughout their explorations, students examined the complex chemistry and physics principles related to their work.

Families and community members were closely involved throughout the entire project. Students were inspired by real-life scientists, engineers, and high school students who generously and enthusiastically shared their time, expertise, and passion for their work. Parents were excited about the authentic learning experiences. Our students truly saw themselves as successful scientists, and they look forward to the innovative science/engineering classes that await them at our own Eden Prairie High School.

From a larger perspective, students became aware of sustainability issues, alternative energy sources, and current events pertaining to our scientific inquiry. In the end, these young scientists impressed their teachers with their knowledge, creativity, patience, questioning, and perseverance.

Finally, in addition to the two classes of fourth graders directly involved in the project, many other students were impacted indirectly. All 850 students at Cedar Ridge were enthusiastic witnesses to a 26-turbine wind farm at work, displayed at the entrance to the building. Our fourth graders were proud to be a part of a project that elicited comments from other students such as, "Wow!" "Awesome!" "Do we get to do that when we're in fourth grade?"

Thank you for making all of the above possible. We look forward to another great year of refining and expanding our work so that even more students can be a part of this incredible experience.

FOUNDATION GRANTS \$30,500 DONATED TO SIX RECIPIENTS

The Foundation for Eden Prairie Schools received 24 grant requests totaling \$190,000 during the fall of 2007. The Foundation was able to fund six of those grants totaling \$30,500. Grants ranged from \$4,000 to \$7,000 and affected hundreds of students at a variety of grade levels and abilities. The Foundation seeks to make large grants that foster innovation and result in projects that engage and motivate students. This year's grants clearly meet these criteria. Briefly, this year's grants allowed for:

- An interdisciplinary exploration of alternative energy sources including fuel cell technology (see teachers' comments in the sidebar),
- Smaller, more accessible Smartboard technology for special needs students,
- Purchase of non-fiction reading resources in support of a strategy to integrate non-fiction reading with elementary school lessons,
- Trial use of stability chairs (ball chairs) for ADHD students at Oak Point and CMS,
- Further development of an art program at Forest Hills which included training for grade-school-aged docents (tour guides) who conducted guided tours for parents and students, and
- A series of Math Nights allowing hundreds of parents and students to explore fun and practical applications of math together.

Clearly there is room to do more. The Foundation is limited by its financial resources, but not by a lack of teacher innovation or creativity.



The Foundation's Present With a Future program allows parents to recognize staff who

have had a significant and positive impact on their children. This past year, \$3,600 was donated, of which, \$2,100 was passed back to recognize staffs' schools and \$1,500 was received as a donation by the Foundation. This is a win-win-win program. Staff members receive much-appreciated recognition for their work, schools receive a financial gift that may be used at their discretion and the Foundation utilizes one-half the amount donated to further its mission. FEPS SCHOLARSHIP ADDITIONAL \$54,000 DONATED TO SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Holasek-Griffiths Scholarship was established in 2000 with a \$140,000 donation by Mr. Harold Griffiths, whose wife graduated from Eden Prairie High School. Last summer, Mr. Griffiths generously donated an additional \$54,000. As a result, the Foundation was able to increase the Holasek-Griffiths scholarship to \$3,500 per year for four years. This scholarship is awarded annually to a student interested in studying business, engineering or computer science. This year's recipient was Kyle Knutson. Past and current recipients will receive a total of \$12,500 in scholarship payments this fall. The Foundation is grateful to Mr. Griffiths whose generosity clearly demonstrates how "A Legacy of Giving" can help to shape the lives of Eden Prairie students.
