



The Noel-Karulf/Class of 1973 “Spirit” Scholarship

Originally established in June 2013, as an outgrowth of their 40th high school class reunion, Class of 1973 EPHS Alumni, Dr. Richard and Deborah (Noel) Karulf offer this scholarship to honor a student who exemplifies the “spirit” of EPHS. The recipient of this scholarship must demonstrate his/her dedication to EPHS through success in academics, active involvement and leadership in extra-curricular activities, and commitment to volunteerism. Additionally, the applicant must intend to pursue a major in the people helping profession of Social Work or Psychology/Counseling.

Criteria:

This scholarship is awarded to an Eden Prairie High School senior who:

- 1) Maintains a minimum 3.5 Grade Point Average
- 2) Actively participates in school, community and voluntary activities
- 3) Demonstrates initiative and leadership in his/her academics, extra-curricular involvements, and voluntary efforts
- 4) Pursues a post-secondary education at a four year college with a major in Social Work or Psychology/ Counseling

Award Amount:

The Noel-Karulf/Class of 1973 Spirit Scholarship will award \$1000 to a deserving student; this scholarship is not renewable.

Procedure:

- The application process will take place through Eden Prairie High School’s Multi-Scholarship Application process.
- Please complete the Multi-Scholarship application through EPHS’s online Naviance system. The system is available from December 14, 2018 – February 6, 2019.
- This scholarship requires a letter of recommendation. Letters of recommendation currently in Naviance will be used. If you do not have a letter of recommendation in Naviance, one must be uploaded by a teacher.
- **Applications are due by 3:00 p.m. on February 6, 2019.**
- A committee will choose the recipient and the scholarship will be awarded at the Community Scholarship Awards night in May 2019.
