



Randell D. Voas/Randy's Run Scholarship

The Randell D. Voas Memorial Scholarship was established by the mother, brother, wife and children of Major Randell D. Voas, USAF, who was killed in action in Afghanistan, April 9, 2010. In 2011, a group of Randy's friends, established Randy's Run to provide a scholarship in his honor. Beginning in 2016 the proceeds from Randy's Run will be combined with the funds established by his family to have one scholarship in his honor, the Randell D. Voas/Randy's Run Scholarship. Major Voas attended Eden Prairie Schools from first grade to his graduation from Eden Prairie High School in 1985.

Criteria:

This scholarship is awarded to an Eden Prairie High School senior who:

- 1) has a grade point average of 3.25 or higher;
- 2) is actively participating in one or more of the following activities that Randy participated in: Nordic Ski, Cross Country, Band, Boy Scouts, NHS; and
- 3) is pursuing some type of post-secondary education – **vocational, junior college, community college, or university.**

Award Amount:

The Randell D. Voas/Randy's Run Scholarship is \$2000 per academic year, and is not renewable.

Procedure:

- The application process will take place through Eden Prairie High School's Multi-Scholarship Application process.
- Please complete the Multi-Scholarship application through EPHS's online Naviance system. The system is available from December 14, 2018 – February 6, 2019.
- Randy's Run applicants must submit a letter of recommendation that specifically addresses your qualifications for the Randy's Run Scholarship. Teachers/coaches can upload this to Naviance before 3pm on February 6, 2019.
- This scholarship requires an additional essay. The essay is part of the application through EPHS's online Naviance system.
- **Applications are due by 3:00 p.m. on February 6, 2019.**
- A committee will choose the recipient and the scholarship will be awarded at the Community Scholarship Awards night in May 2019.
